DR. JENNIFER HINTON

is a **systems researcher** and **activist** in the field of sustainable economy. Her work focuses on how societies relate to profit and how this relationship affects global sustainability challenges. Jennifer's background is in sustainability science, systems analysis, and economics. Her experiences living and working around the world (USA, China, Greece, France, UK, and Sweden) have culminated in a rich perspective about how economic drivers affect societal issues from the small to the large scale. In her doctoral thesis, "Relationshipto-Profit: A Theory of Business, Markets, and Profit for Social Ecological Economics", she developed an understanding of how profit-seeking economies systemically drive social and ecological exploitation, and how alternatives exist and can be nurtured. Her first book (inpress) "How on Earth: Flourishing in a Not-For-Profit World By 2050", offers a vision of how a not-for-profit market economy could equitably meet human needs within the limits of the planet, and how a transition to such an economy is possible. She holds a PhD in Sustainability Science from Stockholm University and a PhD in Economics from the University of Clermont Auvergne. Jennifer is also an experienced facilitator of immersive learning experiences that explore the relationships between nature, society and economics. Her approach engages participants in a collaborative process of unpacking the complex and important topics of sustainability. As an advocate of economic transitions for sustainability, she collaborates with civil society organisations, businesses, and policy makers to transform the economy towards regeneration. She is a senior research fellow at the Schumacher Institute and has been a core member of the AdaptEconII project, the Post-Growth Economics Network, 36x36, Transition Athens, and the Post Growth Institute.

TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT GUIDELINES

The Erasmus+ programme offers Green Travel Support for people traveling to Athens from France, Greece and The Netherlands using sustainable modes of transport, such as carpooling, bus or train or bicycle. Keep your travel tickets and invoices safe. You will need these to be eligible for Green Travel Support.

If green travel is not used, reimbursement limits are lower : 410€ > 360€; 210€ > 180€

Reimbursement will be done by bank transfer upon the presentation of the invoices & travel documents within 60 days after the finalization of the follow up activities (Youthpass certificate & Participation questionnaire).

To reimburse expenses it is mandatory to attend the 100% training course.

There is a sliding scale 50 - 130 EUR fee for the Training Course to support the cofinancing and implementation of the activities, based on personal financial possibilities.
